Chief Llewellyn began his career in Law Enforcement in June 1979 as a Patrolman with the City of Mentor Police Department. He served as a Field Training Officer and as an Evidence Technician. He was assigned to the Detective Bureau where he served for eight years and investigated criminal cases including capital murders.

He was promoted to Patrol Sergeant and then to the Officer in Charge of the Detective Bureau.

In 1995 Chief Llewellyn was promoted to Lieutenant and Operations Captain in 2001. He served on the SWAT Team for twenty years and was assigned as a team leader and ultimately the SWAT Commander.

Chief Llewellyn was appointed as Chief of Police of the Mentor Police Department in 2003, where he currently serves. He served as Temporary City Manager in addition to his police chief's responsibilities for over five months in 2009.

Chief Llewellyn is a graduate of the 187th FBI National Academy class and past president of the Lake County Police Chiefs Association.

Chief Llewellyn's formal education includes an Associate Degree in Criminology, a Bachelors of Science in Police Administration and a Masters of Science Degree in the Administration of Justice.

His assessment training includes the Ohio Association Chiefs of Police training and International Association Chiefs of Police training. He has participated in promotional assessments in the cities of Eastlake, Ohio, East Cleveland, Broadview Heights and Wheeling, West Virginia.
