Brian Quinn is the Chief of Police for the Upper Arlington Division of Police. He earned his undergraduate degree in Criminal Justice from Bowling Green State University and a Masters Degree from Tiffin University. He joined the Upper Arlington Police Division in 1988 and served as a Field Training Officer, Detective, Patrol Sergeant, and has rotated through command of all three bureaus in the Division as a Lieutenant at various times since 1997. He is a graduate of the 21st session of the Police Executive Leadership College through Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police and in 1999 graduated from the Upper Arlington Leadership Program and served on its Board of Directors for 6 years.

He is a graduate of the 208th Session of Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy in March 2002. He was named the 7th Upper Arlington Chief of Police on November 28, 2005. He currently serves on the Executive Board for the Ohio Chapter of the FBI National Academy, the executive committee for the Supervisor Training and Education Program (STEP) through the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police STEP and other Franklin County Homeland Security Committees. He has previously served as a CALEA assessor and has participated in numerous promotional assessments within the State of Ohio.
