Chief Schenck began his career in Law Enforcement in March 1975 as a Patrolman with the Fredericktown Police Department (Knox County). In August 1977, Chief Schenck returned to his hometown, Miamisburg (Montgomery County) as a Patrolman. He was promoted to Sergeant in 1980, Lieutenant in 1987 and Chief of Police in 1988 where he served until March 2002. He then was appointed Chief of Police in Moraine (Montgomery County) in June 2002 where he is still serving.

Chief Schenck is a graduate of Sinclair Community College with an Associates Degree in Law Enforcement, a graduate of the University of Dayton with a Bachelors Degree in Criminal Justice, a graduate of the 140<sup>th</sup> session of the FBI National Academy and a graduate of the Police Executive Leadership College (PELC).
