Chief Stephen W. Thornton served with the Wooster Police Department for 34 years and held the position of Chief of Police from 1998 until his retirement in 2007. He held the rank of Sergeant from 1975 to 1992 and Lieutenant from 1992-1998. Prior to coming to Wooster, Stephen worked for the Rittman Police Department in 1972-1973. The Wooster Police Department has 38 sworn officers & 5 civilian and 5 auxiliary officers under his command.

Chief Thornton has an Associate degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Akron, a BS Technical Education Degree in Criminal Justice also from the University of Akron and is a graduate of the FBI Great Lakes Leadership Seminar.
